WOMEN IN FOCUS began in September of 1974 when a group of women started to produce much needed video tapes/films on the topic of women's problems and experience of their lives. These tapes were produced, directed and created by women.

As women artists, it has become clear to us that images of women and women's lives have always been made and defined from a male perspective. Women have been consistently discriminated against in the media/visual arts, grossly misrepresented in its images, and withheld from the opportunity of obtaining the skills, knowledge and distribution necessary to effectively influence others with their own images and analyses.

Because so few women do gain the recognition they deserve WOMEN IN FOCUS believes it is essential to continue to expand our distribution library with the works of other feminist women artists, as well as our own productions. By doing this work, we will contribute towards the ideas, beliefs and knowledge that make up the dominant ideology of our time.

The WOMEN IN FOCUS centre is open from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on week-days where we organize workshops, seminars, presentations, and work on productions and distribution.

- 4. Shipping address and name.
- 5. Name and address of person to be billed if different from shipping address.
- 6. Cheque or money order made out to **WOMEN IN FOCUS**. (Please be sure to include the shipping fee in addition to the rental fee.)

Provisional or telephone orders will be held for 10 days until a written request reaches us.

Changes or Cancellations must reach us by telephone or mail a maximum of 5 days before the exhibition date.

#### **RETURN SHIPPING**


Customers are responsible for all shipping charges (via mail, courier or other method), as stated on the invoice.

Tapes/films MUST BE RETURNED THE MORNING OF THE FIRST BUSINESS DAY after the SHOWDATE. **WOMEN IN FOCUS** allows 14 days return period which begins from the Showdate marked on the Packing Slip. If the tape/film is not returned by the RETURN DATE, late fees will be charged. Without exception, customers will be charged for lost bookings that result from delayed returns.

We reserve the right to telegraph or telephone collect to request return or inquire regarding overdue tapes/films, and fees.

When returning tapes/films use the padded envelope provided, return via the method marked on the Packing Slip, all mailed material must be sent FIRST CLASS and INSURED as follows:

#### DAMAGES AND LOSS

If negligence on the part of the exhibitor results in damage to any portion of a tape/film, the exhibitor will be required to pay damages.

Rental of a tape/film allows the renter to exhibit the tape/film on the exhibition date. Each booking is for the renter's own use: tapes/films cannot be subleased, distributed, edited, altered, televised or duplicated.

Purchase of a tape/film allows the purchaser to exhibit the tape/film as frequently as desired. It does not allow the purchaser to distribute, sell, lease, televise in whole or in part, edit, alter, circulate or duplicate the tape/film without the prior written permission of WOMEN IN FOCUS.

#### VIDEOTAPES:

THE FLECK WOMEN colour 1978 Produced by Kem Murch 24 min.

A documentary tracing the personal and political struggle of 80 women striking for a first contract against Fleck Manufacturing in Huron Park, Ontario. This tape, produced while the strike was in progress, illustrates the courage and bonding process of the women involved in this collective action. Their fight was not only against appalling working conditions but also against massive and sometimes brutal police harassment.




