- Sisters Stewart + Coleman: disagree w/ Belmonte - when Coleman + Stewart went to Belmonte it was found that pay due Sister Coleman had all been there, in 2 envelopes, but Sister Coleman, in her haste, had only picked up one. Not accepting the explanation in good faith grace, in fact not waiting for an explanation, she conducted herself in a very offensive + insulting manner before customers, + finally left in a huff, not even bothering to pick up the rest of the \$. This sort of conduct casts very unfavourable reflections on the whole union, and is much to be regretted.

Note. The actions of Sister Hilda Coleman + several other sisters, in walking off the floor during the busy hours is severely frowned upon, as being unbecoming + very unconsiderate of a union member. Such an action does not put the management out as much, as it puts a hardship on girls remaining on the floor. A union member must bear in mind, that differences must be settled in an ethical manner, and the welfare of fellow workers

always must be kept in mind.

It also has been noted that unducharges have been made on cheques
checks

in one of the houses, to the customers and also checks to the girls off duty, coming in for a meal, & paying for pie & coffee. Agreed such actions reflect not only on the honesty of the girls, but also on the union.
