Out of Work Stamps policy: Union members receive out of work stamps on payment of dues at a rate of 50cents/mo under the following conditions: I) The member was dismissed from his or her place of employment. If they left voluntarily they are ineligible. II) must be out of work for a period not less than 30 days. III) must register with the office & from that date will be considered qualified for OOWS. IV) must be available for work at all times. V) Union officers shall be sole judge as to suitability of filling vacancies in the members, particularly classification of work. VI) If refused OOWS they can appeal to the executive. If that appeal result is unsatisfactory, the member has the right to appeal to the membership. VII) Exe to review every 3mos and recommend any changes/adjustments they deem necessary. M/s/c OOWS policy to the read and passed at both Dec 2 and 16 meetings to be adopted.
