1933	17	none	Aug 29	McHugh] A card put in a California car - the people called a policeman. Pickets report business very quiet, policeman still on door.
1933	17	none	Aug 30	Strike Meeting [Brevitt, Long, Walker, McHugh, Snell and Sis Seaman or Leman] Snell, Sid Drinkall asked to picket house from 11pm-1am Mr Mattishaw out on street soliciting business. Business a bit better than usual due to weather conditions.
1933	18	none	Aug 31	Strike Meeting [Brevitt, Long, Walker, Kitto, McDonald] A few parties turned away at door but several parties went in between 8-9pm <b>Mr Harrison (Fair Wage Officer for Western Canada) interviewed Mr Mottishaw who is willing to pay the wages but wants to keep the crew that was in there. Local 28 refused to agree.</b> Harrison will go back to see him in a few days.
